Financial Summary

2017/18 Budget Analysis

The Town Council's budgeted gross revenue expenditure for the year amounted to £1,029,110 and the Council is pleased to announce that a modest surplus will be achieved which will be reinvested to provide future services for the community. A total of £820,755 was raised from residents of the town and the Town Council is fully accountable to residents at the Annual Town Meeting, being held this year on 11 April 2018 in St John's Church. The cost of Town Council services for a Band D property was £71.05 per year, equating to £1.37 per week.

For 2018/19, residents will be aware an increase in council tax of £7.03* (9.9%) has been applied to Burgess Hill Town Council's element of the council tax to fund, in-part, the development of a new community and performance venue. The recent residents' consultation and vote, however, although giving a substantial majority in favour of the project, rejected the increase in council tax. The Town Council will not, therefore, be able to apply for the loan of £5million that was needed for the project. The venue monies raised of £72k through the 2018/19 council tax rise, will be reversed in the 2019/20 budget and credited back to residents.

^{*} of the £7.03 increase, £6.17 is directly attributable to the new venue, the balance being the normal movements in the Town Council's costs.
