# Specialist Items

## **Hearing Aids**

## **Milk Bottle Tops**

## **TerraCycle Burgess Hill**

Hard to recycle items, which aren't collected in kerbside recycling, including crisp and biscuit packets, confectionery wrappers, and more, can be taken to one of Burgess Hill's Terracycle Collection Points. This waste is then sent off for recycling. Each shipment qualifies for TerraCycle Points, which raise money for local charities.
