Lewis and Ken Norris were brothers with an engineering workshop in Burgess Hill. Their Dad was manager of the Gas Works in Leylands Road and lived in a tied cottage. Suggested that Norris name/theme be used for housing.	
	Copestake	Mr Copestake a builder lived at large house called Wyneestay, opposite Junction Road/Keymer road roundabout. The house became a 'hydropathic institution until 1909, then became a convent and school.	
	Lady Hastings		
	Birdcages	a considerable number of Keymer employees also lived in cottages on site. Further cottages were built in Cants Lane - which have now been demolished - that housed brick making tables on the ground floor with living quarters upstairs. These were commonly known as birdcages
