After Her Majesty's funeral, the flowers will be removed, composted and the compost used to plant a memorial tree at Batchelors Farm, at a later date.

St John's Church will be holding a Parish Service on Sunday 11 September, at 10am. Members of the public are welcome to attend. Today - Friday 9 September - at 12 noon, a bell will ring 96 times, one ring for each year of Her Majesty's life.

Further guidance on the National and Local Proclamations, and the date of Her Majesty's funeral will follow, in accordance with national guidelines.
