# Summer Fayre Event Report

Sunday 25 June 2023 11am – 3pm St John's Park, Burgess Hill

**Budget:** £2000 from Town Council **Spent:** £4258.20 £1500 from Burgess Hill District Lions

£1000 budgeted for parade materials Funds raised: £2648.75

Income: £1462.82 as follows:
Pitch fees - £665
Donations from inflatables - £292.32
Miniature Railway – £192.50
Fairground – £160
Ice cream sales – £153

Expenditure after income: £2795.38

#### Aim:

The aim of the Summer Fayre was to deliver a low-cost, fun day out for families, with a mixture of activities, and to create a platform for local community groups and businesses to raise funds and profiles.

#### **Number of Attendees:**

Approximately 2500 visitors throughout the day. The element of the parade ensured a higher level of attendees, as many families came along to see their child in the parade.

#### **Event Breakdown:**

There were forty-four stall holders due to attend the event, plus paid providers. There were some cancellations on the day of the event, meaning the site map had to be rearranged on the day. The team reacted well and there was no discernible difference in the event.

The Fayre was opened with its first-ever parade. This was led by Burgess Hill Marching Youth and multiple organisations joined in with the parade. Flower lanterns were created by children from five local schools (Manorfield, London Meed, Southway, Sheddingdean and Birchwood Grove) as well as by the young carers at Burgess Hill Youth, following a workshop with local community arts charity, Same Sky – these were funded by the Town Council. Other organisations that walked in the parade included: the Girl Guides, Walkhouse School of Dance, Sussex Supremes Baton Twirlers and Burgess Hill Swift Supporters. The parade did a lap of St John's Park to open the event.

Activities for children and families included:

• Fairground games (hook-a-duck, coconut shy, striker etc.)

- Free inflatable assault course
- Crafts with Burgess Hill Youth (t-shirt decorating)
- Miniature railway
- Walkabout entertainment (Bill Oddity's Bewildered Beasts)

Due to the heat, the dog show that had been organised in conjunction with Heath Vets had to be cancelled. The vets set up a dog cooling station, for anyone who had brought their pet along to the event. Both the cancellation and the cooling station were well received by the public.

We organised a collection of food items at the event which was advertised in our publicity campaign, following the success of the Coronation donation drive. Unfortunately, the donations were not as good at this event, but those that were collected were happily received by the Food Bank and the Pantry.

### **Publicity:**

The event was publicised widely through a variation of methods.

On Facebook, an event was created, which reached 7,465 people, with 276 people registering themselves as 'going' to the event online. Posts were regularly published across all three social media platforms (Facebook, Twitter and Instagram) in the lead up to the event. The first posts were made at the beginning of May following the Same Sky workshop. Regular posts were then made for the month leading up to the event, with a post every day in the week leading up to the event day.

A 'save the date' graphic was placed in About Town Magazine. Posters were placed in all Town Council noticeboards, including the one outside the Trading Spaces unit. We had two correx boards on the Bandstand in Church Walk and by the Kiosk in St John's Park. Two banners were placed on McDonald's roundabout and by the Triangle.

Two press releases, one for stall holders and one with event information were sent ahead of the event. A post-event press release was then circulated on the Monday following.

Our events mailing list subscribers received two notifications regarding the event; a 'save the date' a month ahead, and another with more information two weeks before the event.

The Mid Sussex Times published a piece about the event ahead of time, following the second press release.

Following the event, three posts were put on social media, one thanking everyone for attending and asking for feedback, one with pictures of the parade participants, and one thanking attendees for their food donations.

<u>mz78b7dWwY</u>). The Mid Sussex Times also gave the event front page coverage, and a double page spread in the middle of the newspaper, with images of the event.

#### Feedback:

All stall holders at the event were sent a thank you email, following the event. Feedback from all stall holders has been positive, as well as all feedback from the public online.

Many groups found that the event was good for raising both profile and funds for their organisation. The event allowed ten attending groups to raise £2648.75 as follows:

Escape Youth Club - £155.70
Royal British Legion - £144.20
Friends of Woodlands Meed - £35
Walkhouse School of Dance - £26

Paws and Claws - £178 St Peter and St James - £256.60 Swift Supporters - £68 8th Scouts - £705.25 Bonfire Society - £780

Almost all attendees were raising money, but not all gave us information on funds raised.

A small amount of constructive criticism was given including the ideas to not bill the parade as a 'children's' parade, in case it put off community groups from participating, and the possibility of separate entry and exit points for vehicles (unfortunately there is nothing to be done about this suggestion, due to the layout of the park).
