## Overview:

There were five sessions for Wowzer Wednesday, each week in August. The first four events were held by the Bandstand in Church Walk. The final event was held in St John's Park.

Week one was crafts funded by Burgess Hill Community Crafters Market. Due to inclement weather, this was moved to The Kiln. Capacity of the venue limited the numbers attending.
Week two was two, forty-minute magic shows.
Week three was a circus skills workshop, running from 11am - 1pm. Numbers had to be restricted due to capacity with the equipment. The weather was particularly hot on this date.
Week four was two, forty-minute puppet shows.
Week five was an inflatable extravaganza, with laser tag, two bouncy castles and an assault course. Places Leisure supplied soft play and Southern Co-Op provided free snacks and drinks for kids. Little Kickers also provided a free football activity.

## Tennis and Basketball Sessions

## Overview:

In previous years, Sussex Clubs for Young People (SCYP) ran tennis sessions and 'Streetmate' activity sessions with their Purple Bus, funded by the Town Council. Streetmate was targeted towards lower income families in the Denham Road and St Andrew's Road areas. Following the dissolution of SCYP, the Town Council stepped in to provide extra activities in the summer holidays for those in low-income families. The tennis and basketball sessions were run by outside coaches, with the support of Council officers. This saw an increase in officer time over the period of the summer holidays. At Easter, the Town Council paid SCYP £506 for one tennis session and two Streetmate sessions.

The tennis sessions were run in the courts at St John's Park with two qualified coaches. The sessions were run as drop-in and saw a high level of attendees. Occasionally, due to capacity, sessions were split into smaller groups.

The basketball sessions were run at the Maple Drive Multisports Court. As there was only one coach, sessions were limited to 12 children and had to be booked in advance. There was not an option for drop ins. The first session on 18 August saw poor weather, limiting the number of attendees. Worth Parish Council's Youth Worker, Drew, kindly coached the sessions with support from officers. The majority of attendees to the basketball sessions were 8 and under.

## Feedback on events:

Every Wowzer Wednesday was posted on social media following the event.
Separate posts were also created for the tennis and basketball sessions. Posters for every event were placed in the noticeboards, and correx boards and banners for Wowzer Wednesday were placed in different areas around the town.

Feedback from the public was overwhelmingly positive, with all attendees appearing to be very happy at the events on the day.

## Constructive Criticism:

One response was that basketball could have been better advertised for more uptake. This is good feedback, but sessions were already limited to 12 children, and almost all sessions were fully booked. We cannot control people not showing up on the day. The event was organized only a few weeks before the event, as it was a sudden addition to the summer holiday programme. Therefore, it was not added to the summer holiday activity flyer. Despite this, it was still a very popular
activity, and was a good opportunity to showcase the new sports facility at Maple Drive.

Feedback on the tennis sessions included, children needing to do more practice and requests for the sessions to be conducted more regularly in Burgess Hill. The tennis is clearly popular and that is something to consider for 2024.

One response on Wowzer Wednesday suggested that the circus skills could have had activities for children to watch, not just to participate in. This would be tricky with the session, as both members of staff need to be watching the children and helping them with their activities. The option of circus skills to watch could be a separate event.
